Purpose

Board Directors provide governance, fiduciary oversight, and strategic leadership to advance the mission of the South San Francisco Chamber of Commerce: supporting local businesses and strengthening the economic vitality of the community.

Core Responsibilities

Board Directors are expected to be active, engaged, and accountable leaders who contribute time, expertise, and resources.

- Actively uphold and advance the mission, vision, and strategic priorities of the Chamber.
- Attend and participate meaningfully in board meetings, assigned committee meetings, and key Chamber events.
- Provide strategic input and support implementation of board-approved initiatives and goals.
- Fulfill fiduciary duties, including oversight of finances, budgets, audits, and material business decisions.
- Serve as a visible ambassador for the Chamber, building relationships with members, partners, and community stakeholders.
- Support fundraising and resource development efforts to ensure the Chamber's financial sustainability.
- Provide appropriate guidance and oversight to the CEO and staff without engaging in day-to-day operations.
- Contribute to the development, review, and approval of Chamber policies and governance practices.

Fundraising & Financial Commitment

All Board Directors are required to support the Chamber financially through a **give-or-get commitment of \$2,500 annually**. This may be fulfilled through a personal contribution, securing sponsorships, donations, or a combination of both. Agreement to this requirement is mandatory for board service.

Qualifications

- Demonstrated leadership experience in business, nonprofit, or community settings.
- Strong communication skills and the ability to work collaboratively with diverse stakeholders.
- Commitment to ethical conduct, accountability, and good governance.
- Strategic mindset with the ability to think critically and make informed decisions.
- Financial literacy and comfort reviewing budgets and financial reports.
- Willingness and capacity to commit time, talent, and financial support.
- Residency or business operation in South San Francisco is preferred.

Time Commitment

- Approximately 9–12 board meetings per year.
- An average of 6–10 hours per month, including meetings, events, committee work, and outreach.
- Availability for special meetings or Chamber events as needed.

Compensation

This is a volunteer position. Reasonable, pre-approved expenses related to board duties may be reimbursed.

One of the things we pride ourselves on is providing real value. With rising costs impacting everyone, I want to share a quick update regarding our membership. The Chamber has not increased its dues in over a decade, but to ensure we can continue providing high-quality services, our Board of Directors has voted for a nominal increase. For our Classic Rate, dues will move from \$250 to \$275 in 2026, and then to \$300 in 2027. There will be similar nominal increases across all other membership categories as well. Even with this change, the South San Francisco Chamber remains **the most affordable chamber** on the Peninsula. These additional funds will allow us to offer more for you, including specialized training and new marketing opportunities for your business.

Speaking of training, we are kicking things off with our January Mixer on Wednesday, January 21, at **Thai Satay**. We've included a session on social media posting for your business, and it's a great chance to meet our new **City Manager, Laura Snideman**. And of course, the food and drinks at Thai Satay are always incredible.

Looking ahead to February, we are doing something a bit different. On February 5, we're heading to the Farallon Room at Skyline College for a massive collaborative mixer, the **Sunset Soiree** with the **Daly City/Colma and Burlingame/SFO Chambers**. 2026 Business Compliance Update

Stay informed on the latest local and state regulations impacting South San Francisco employers.

Local South San Francisco Mandates

- **Minimum Wage Increase:** As of January 1, 2026, the local minimum wage in South San Francisco is **\$18.15 per hour**. This applies to all employees (adults and minors) who work at least two hours per week within city limits.
- **Required Posting:** Employers must post the official **2026 Minimum Wage Poster** in a conspicuous place. (Available in English, Spanish, Tagalog, and Chinese on the city website).
- **Business License Renewals:** The deadline to renew your 2026 business license is **February 28, 2026**. Avoid a 10% late penalty by filing before March 1.

Retirement Mandate (CalSavers)

- **Final Deadline Passed:** As of January 1, 2026, **all** California employers with at least one employee are now required to provide a retirement plan.
- **Action Required:** If you do not offer a private plan (like a 401k), you must register for **CalSavers**. If you *do* offer a private plan, you must still visit the CalSavers website to **certify your exemption** to avoid fines.
- **Penalties:** Non-compliant businesses face state penalties starting at **\$250 per employee**, increasing to \$750 if left unaddressed.

New California Employment Laws

- **Workplace Rights Notice (SB 294):** Employers must provide a new, standalone "Workplace Know Your Rights" written notice to all employees by **February 1, 2026**. This covers workers' comp, union rights, and immigration inspection protections.
- **Emergency Contact Mandate:** By **March 30, 2026**, all employers must allow employees to designate an emergency contact specifically to be notified if the employee is arrested or detained at the worksite.
- **Pay Transparency (SB 642):** When posting jobs, employers must now provide a "good faith" salary range based on what they actually expect to pay upon hire.
- **Personnel Records (SB 513):** The legal definition of "personnel records" has expanded. Upon request, employers must now provide employees with copies of their education and training records (certificates, competency tracking, etc.) if maintained by the company.

Retail & Environmental Alerts

- **Plastic Bag Ban (SB 1053):** Most retail and grocery stores can no longer offer "thick" plastic reusable bags at checkout. Only recycled paper bags (min. \$0.10 charge) or certified highly durable reusable bags are permitted.
 - **Tip Protection:** The Labor Commissioner now has expanded authority to issue direct citations for any business that unlawfully withholds or delays the distribution of employee tips.

National Blood Donor Month

January is typically a period of critical blood shortages because people stop donating blood during the holidays.

Donating blood helps people who have an illness such as cancer, anemia, [sickle cell disease](#), or [hemophilia](#).

If you donate blood before you have surgery, your own blood will be stored for you in case you need a blood transfusion. If you don't need it, your blood may be donated to someone else.

When you donate whole blood, you give about 1 pint (473 mL). It takes about 10 minutes; however, the whole process, including answering questions and having a brief exam takes up to an hour.

To donate blood in California, you must:

- Be at least 17 years old. Sixteen-year-olds can donate with a signed parental consent form, which may be required each time you donate.
- Weigh at least 110 pounds.
- Be in generally good health and feeling well on the day of the donation, free of cold or flu symptoms, fever, or active infections.
- Have a current, valid photo ID such as a driver's license, passport, or student ID with your name and date of birth.
- Eat a healthy meal within a few hours before donating (avoiding fatty foods) and drink plenty of non-alcoholic fluids.

Donated blood is tested to ensure it is safe to use. It's also checked for its type. This ensures that the person who needs blood gets the right type.
