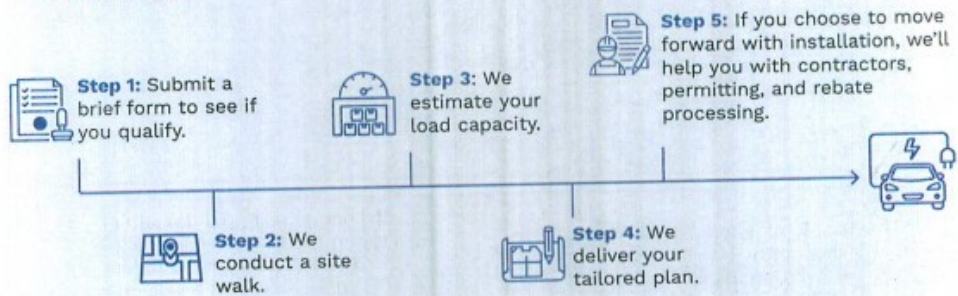

Spotlight on our Member Graniterock!



Graniterock's 126-Year Legacy Thrives on the Peninsula

Some companies talk about being committed to the communities they serve. Graniterock has proved it for 126 years.

Founded in 1900 as a family-owned company headquartered in Watsonville, Graniterock has grown into one of the most trusted names in construction materials and infrastructure across the San Francisco Bay Area. Here on the Peninsula, the company's legacy shows up every day in the roads we drive, the buildings that rise and infrastructure projects that keep the region moving forward.

Graniterock operates asphalt plants in South San Francisco and Redwood City, producing high-quality materials that pave the way for infrastructure projects large and small, including San Francisco International Airport. In Redwood City, the company operates a concrete facility and a Graniterock Supply retail location, where contractors, landscapers and homeowners can find everything from aggregate and landscape materials to hardscape products and construction tools.

Graniterock's construction team has helped some of South San Francisco's recent developments get off the ground. The company performed site work for 410 Noor, a mixed-use residential development bringing 338 new homes to South San Francisco. For a GM Cruise autonomous vehicle facility in San Francisco, a \$12.7 million project, Graniterock delivered complex site development work across multiple scopes. And at 651 Gateway, an Alexandria Real Estate biotech project converting traditional office space into state-of-the-art laboratory facilities, Graniterock tackled a sophisticated underground scope including 1,000 feet of pipe work using an innovative method that pulls new pipe through old pipe with minimal excavation.

What sets Graniterock apart goes well beyond the materials produced and projects built. Community involvement is baked into the culture. From sponsoring local events to volunteering alongside nonprofit partners to investing in the next generation of tradespeople, Graniterock shows up as a neighbor, as well as a trusted builder.

In an era when many companies come and go, there is something powerful about a 126-year-old family business that is still here, building and investing in the future of the San Francisco Bay Area.

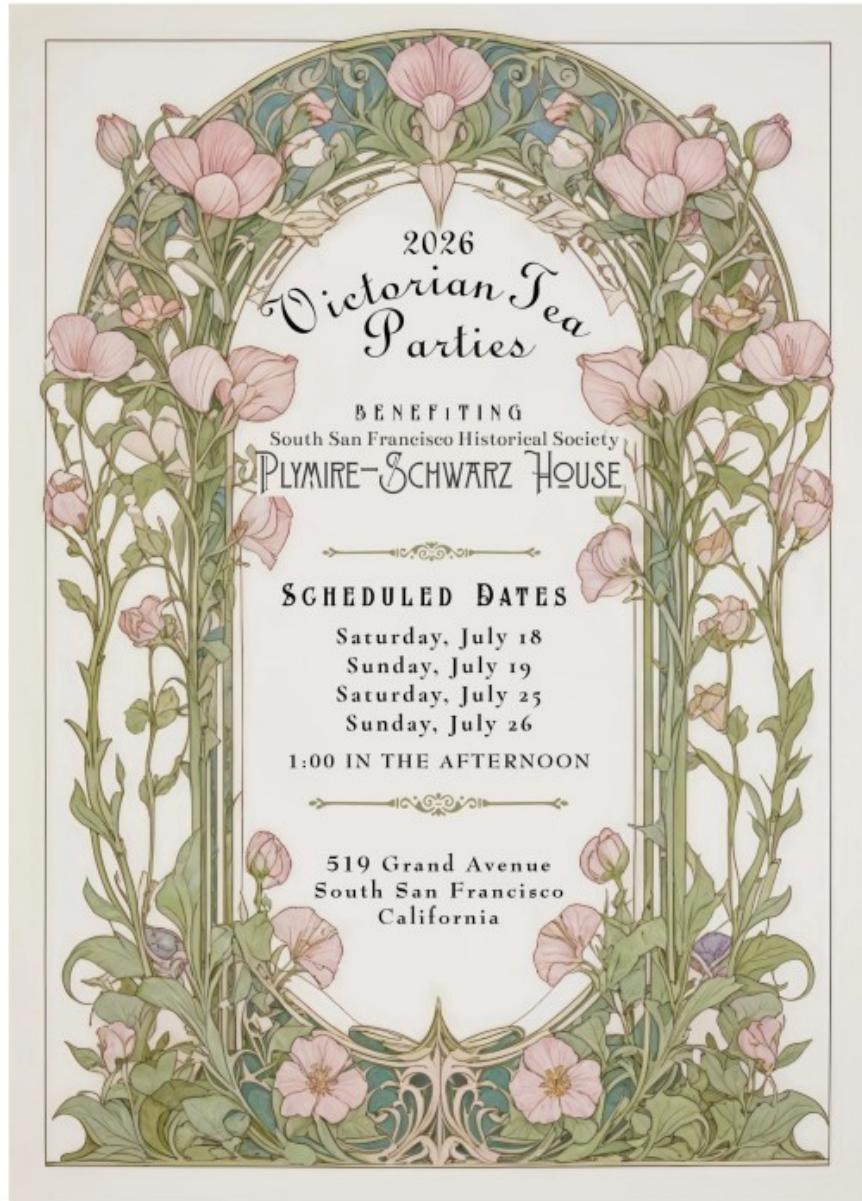
