Important Update for Chamber Members: Understanding the Impact of SB478 on Local Businesses

The California Legislature has recently passed SB478, a new bill aimed at enhancing pricing transparency across several industries, including hospitality and entertainment. Authored by Senator Nancy Skinner (D-Berkeley) and Senator Bill Dodd (D-Napa), with support from the attorney general's office, this legislation targets the elimination of "junk fees" — undisclosed costs added to the prices of services like concert tickets, hotel bookings, and dining.

For Restaurants: SB478 requires a clear upfront declaration of any additional charges typically added to the bill. This adjustment means that restaurants will need to modify how they present their pricing to customers. While this may require some initial adjustments in menu and billing practices, it could also enhance trust and satisfaction among patrons, which is beneficial for business reputation and customer loyalty.

For Hotels: The new legislation impacts hotels by addressing the common practice of adding extra fees, such as resort fees or charges for amenities, which are often disclosed only at the time of payment. Hotels must now integrate these costs into the initially displayed room rates or eliminate them. This transparency can simplify the booking process and make pricing clearer, potentially attracting more guests who value straightforward cost presentations.

For Other Affected Businesses: Businesses involved in event planning, ticket sales, or any service that involves supplementary fees will need to revise how they disclose these costs. This includes making all potential fees known upfront to avoid any surprises for customers at the point of sale.

Looking Ahead: While the shift required by SB478 might pose operational challenges and initial financial considerations for businesses, it also presents an opportunity to distinguish your business through transparency. Businesses that adopt clear pricing quickly may attract consumers who are increasingly looking for transparency and straightforward billing.

As your Chamber of Commerce, we are here to assist our members in navigating these changes. We encourage you to review your current pricing structures and consider how best to implement these new requirements. Adopting these changes not only aligns with legal compliance but can also enhance consumer trust, potentially driving more business your way in a competitive market.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, which has been observed in the U.S. since 1949 to fight the stigma surrounding mental illness, help educate the public about mental health and wellness, support those who need help, and advocate for mental health policies.

In early May 2023, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy, MD, released an advisory addressing the "epidemic of loneliness and isolation" that's affecting the country and laid out a plan for advancing social connection since loneliness and isolation contribute to a range of health risks.

The numbers of people who said they had no close friends went from 3% in 1990 to 12% in 2021, according to the World Economic Forum.

Here are a few practical suggestions for making friends:

Reach out

Haven't heard from a friend in a while? Pick up the phone and say hello. Schedule regular calls with loved ones or schedule a trip to catch up in person.

Take the lead

Invite a new or old friend to lunch. Organize a neighborhood block party, group get together or a crafting or book club circle.

Get out there

Friendships can be made on shared interests. Take a class or volunteer in your community. After you make a new friend, initiate meeting for coffee or tea.

Ask for help

If you're lonely and having difficulty connecting with others, we recommend support and therapy groups — another place where friendships can grow.

No matter where you are on your mental health journey, we're with you with our mental health and wellness tools and services. These include emotional wellness apps that are available to members at no extra cost. These apps can help you navigate life's challenges, build resilience, and take meaningful steps towards being happier and healthier. You can also access our mental health and wellness support anytime.


